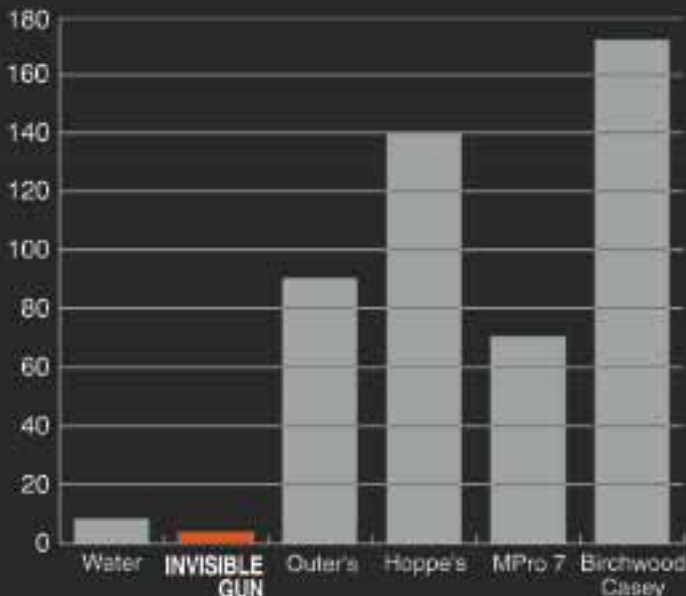

Their sense of smell is so keen that deer rely on scent for just about everything — from finding mates and food to detecting predators.

Step 1 - Cleaning:

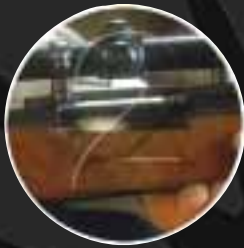


Hold gun barrel above gun mat, attach brush to rod and saturate with Scentless Solvent. Push with rod handle, keeping rod centered in bore. Push brush through barrel to loosen caked fouling and streaks of lead.

Remove brush and put on cleaning tip. Attach patch to tip, saturate with Scentless Solvent, and work back and forth through barrel.

Continue with Scentless Solvent-soaked patches until one comes out clean.

Step 2 - Drying:



Use dry Scent Neutralizing Patches to remove remaining solvent from within the barrel and from all other solvent coated areas. Scent Neutralizing Patches are infused with our special Invisible Gun Scent Neutralizer, working to clean and dry your gun while enhancing the odor elimination process.

Step 3 - Oiling:



After all parts have been thoroughly cleaned and dried, push a clean Scent Neutralizing Patch lightly coated with Scentless Oil through the bore, making sure all surfaces are covered. Oil revolver cylinders very sparingly. Apply Scentless Oil to all working parts and exterior metal surfaces. Wipe off excess with patches.

Step 4 - Silicone:



The Odor Neutralizing Cloth is the final phase, adding extra protection from rust while further de-scenting your gun with a special mixture of silicone and Invisible Gun Scent Neutralizer.

That's it. No more harsh chemical odors on your gun, clothes, on your hands, in the woods, or in your home.

NOTE: Fingerprints can cause rapid rusting since there is salt content in perspiration. Whenever a gun is handled, apply a light coat of Scentless Oil or wipe it down with Odor Neutralizing Cloth to eliminate fingerprints. - Detailed instructions and information can be found at www.invisiblegun.com or inside the Invisible Gun kits.

NOTE: Be sure to thoroughly clean firearm with Invisible Gun to remove all grease, oil, and chemical odor from your firearm before shooting. It is a good idea to check firearms periodically and clean/lubricate as needed. Before shooting any firearm, push enough patches through the bore and chamber to remove any grease or oil present. Never attempt to shoot obstructions from the bore of any gun – clean before shooting. Always clean new guns before firing.
